

Working in UX is a creative, fun, and challenging career path.


Are you creative? Interested in human behavior? Want to create products that can have real-world impact?

Careers in UX and HCI

UX Designer:

User experience (UX) designers are involved in the design of digital products and technology, they work out how to create the best possible experience for the end-user.

Starting salary in the UK: £19,000 - £25,000

Senior UX designer's salary: £65,000

UX Researcher:

A UX researcher delivers the best possible experience for the users of a website, making the website as straight-forward to use as possible.

Starting salary in the UK: £20,000 to £25,000

Senior UX researcher's salary: £47,000

Interaction Designer:

Interaction designers make sure digital applications work and function in the hands of users.

Starting salary in UK: £29,000

Senior Interaction Designer salary: £56,000

Our MSc

Our MSc is taught by staff from a world-leading HCI research lab within the School of Computing called Open Lab.

Open Lab is based within the School of Computing in the University's new and multiple award-winning £50M Urban Sciences Building.

Throughout the course you will learn the principles of human-centered design, how to design better products for human experiences.

You will also build an understanding about how the design of digital technologies can impact people at an individual, group or societal level.

Why Newcastle?

Open Lab is based in Newcastle upon Tyne, one of the leading cities for HCI research in the world.

From a world-class campus in the heart of the city, to blue flag coastline, to its thriving tech scene, Newcastle has something everyone!

World-class campus: The Urban Science building is an impressive feat of modern and experimental architecture - a living laboratory with over 7000 sensors. Situated in The Helix, this area is being redeveloped for the next generation of international technologists and scientists.

Affordable housing: The average rents for flats in Newcastle-upon-Tyne are around £500 to £700 pcm, which is around £1000 to £2000 pcm cheaper than in London. With student areas like Jesmond, Heaton and Sandyard - there are plenty of houses.

Access to the coast: Newcastle is a 20-minute drive to the beach or 30 minutes by public transport. The North East has some of the most spectacular beaches in the country, known for its golden sands, surfing and blue flag waters.

Culinary experience: Newcastle is renowned for its spectacular night-life, but did you know that there are 24 restaurants in Newcastle and the North East included in the 2020 Michelin Guide?




Grassroots culture: Newcastle's creative quarter, the Ouseburn Valley, is home to some of the nation's best independent venues, cafes and bars - there's something for everyone to enjoy, day or night!

Thriving tech scene: Newcastle has a thriving tech scene of small and large businesses with over £22m invested in emerging tech between 2015-2019.

Last year Newcastle was awarded **Smart City of the Year** in the Digital Leaders 100 list.

Beautiful bridges and more: Newcastle is famous for its seven bridges which cross the river Tyne including the iconic Tyne Bridge and the Millennium Bridge.

Alongside it's bridges, Newcastle is famous for its beautiful **Georgian architecture**, and is home to an array of cultural venues including the **Sage** – renowned for having some of the best acoustics in the world.
